Krishna Sen: Professor Krishna Sen is a retired Professor of the Department of English of the University of Calcutta. She is an internationally renowned academic specialising in postcolonial studies, Modernism, gender studies, Indian Writing in English and much more.

Puspa Damai: Puspa Damai is an Assistant Professor of English at Marshall University, USA. Dr. Damai has published articles in journals including *Postcolonial Text*, *Discourse* and *CR: The New Centennial Review*.
